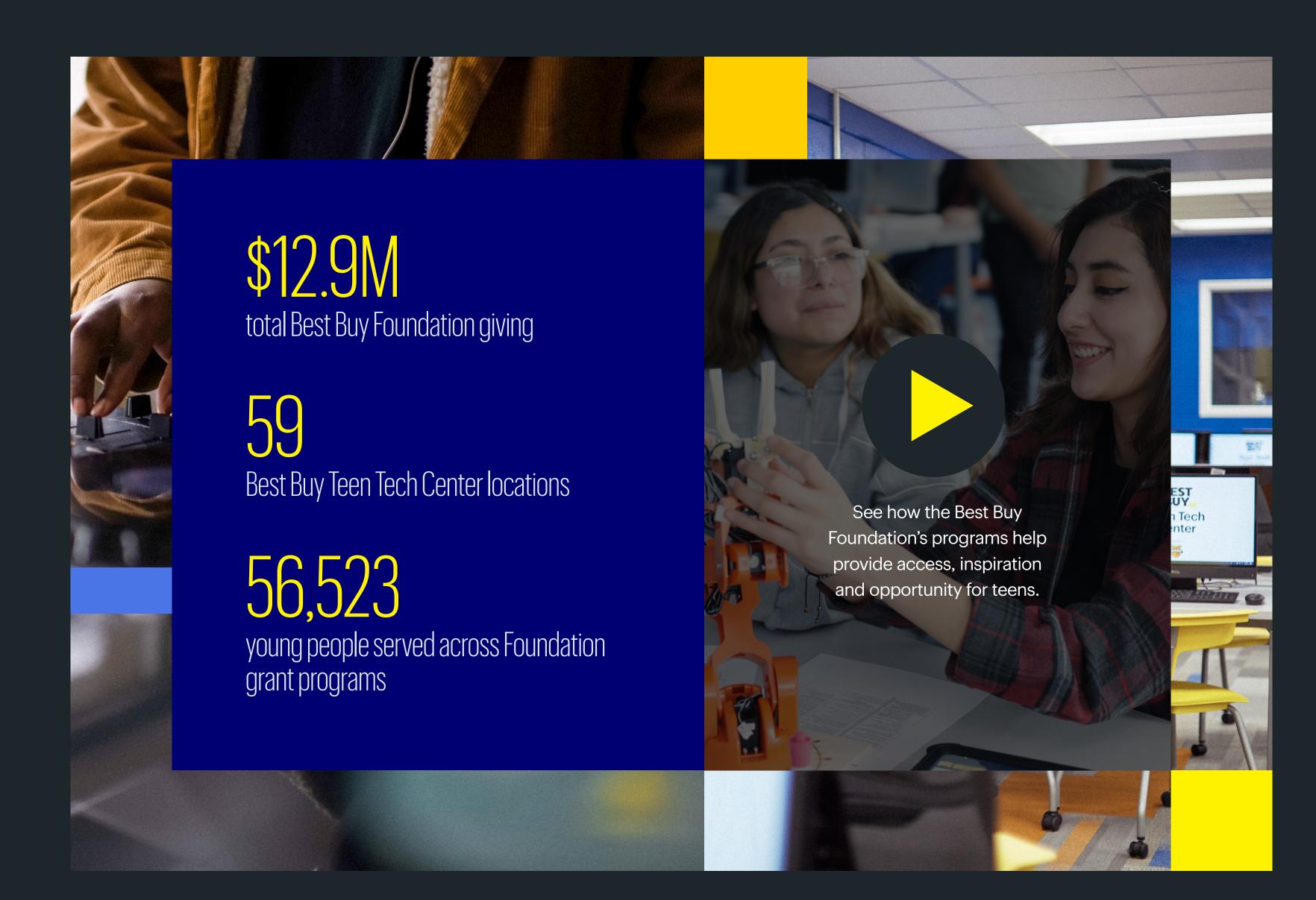
FOUNDATION | OVERVIEW

TEEN TECH CENTERS | OVERVIEW

Building brighter futures through technology.

Best Buy Teen Tech Center programs help bridge the opportunity gap—helping teens achieve their potential and pursue their dreams.

The Foundation's signature initiative was established in 2013 to address a critical need: ensuring that young people from disinvested communities are prepared for a tech-reliant future.

The **Best Buy Teen Tech Center program** aims to provide safe after-school learning environments where teens have access to cutting-edge technology, mentors who help build their confidence and activities that support school and career success.

Our bigg est differentiator as a corporate foundation is our unique partnership model that engages vendors and customers in our mission. It's through our partnerships that we are able to build brighter futures—together.



Participants receive personalized coaching and mentorship, learn technical and life skills, and explore career opportunities in STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math).

Teen Tech Centers are driven by our unique partnership model, which starts with community-based nonprofit organizations that host each location and provide insight into the needs of their local area. Then, we convene a broad network of donors, including:

- Best Buy customers and other individuals
- Businesses whose employees volunteer their time and expertise
- Companies that donate much of the equipment

Their contributions are essential for the success of the program and the resources needed to ensure a high-quality experience for all participants.



TEEN TECH CENTERS | STRATEGY

A teen-focused framework for success.



Tools for the future.

Each Best Buy Teen Tech Center is outfitted with professional-grade technology, much of which is donated by Best Buy vendor partners, including some of the world's largest tech companies, and other organizations. Teens create, learn skills and explore video production, graphic design, audio engineering, robotics, 3D printing, virtual reality and more.



Skills for school, work and life.

By engaging with local companies and working professionals, teens learn about jobs in their community and beyond—and how they can turn their dreams into realities.



Caring, coaching and building relationships.

Youth development professionals and other adult role models provide supportive guidance, encouraging teens to pursue their own interests, talk about their futures and build their confidence.

TEEN TECH CENTERS | LEARNING MODEL

Learning by doing.

The Best Buy Teen Tech Center program is based on an innovative learning model developed by <u>The Clubhouse Network</u> in collaboration with the MIT Media Lab. It leverages new technologies to support learning experiences and engage young people through technology and the arts, focusing on four key tenets.

TEEN TECH CENTERS | APPROACH

Continuous improvement, expanding impact.

The Teen Tech Center program is focused on integrating the latest research-based methodologies, youth development best practices and new technologies.

We seek to continuously measure our progress and identify areas for improvement, so we can increase the positive impact we're having on young people and their communities.



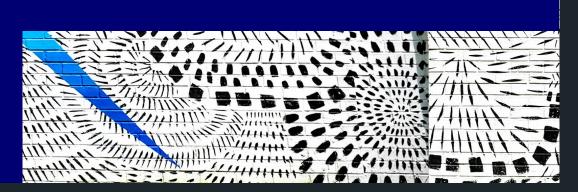

Hands-on learning, real-world benefits.

Our goal is for every Teen Tech Center participant to experience:

- High-quality STEAM education
- Hands-on, project-based learning
- Positive relationships with mentors and peers

Measuring success.

We thoughtfully evaluate our programs so we can incorporate innovations and improvements. This includes regular surveys and focus groups with key stakeholders and a longitudinal study to measure long-term programmatic impact.

Caring for the whole teen.

In addition to fostering positive relationships with mentors and peers, we have integrated youth-centered mental health and wellness programming, as well as training for Teen Tech Center staff.

TEEN TECH CENTERS | CAREER PATHWAYS

Pathways to career possibilities.

The **Career Pathways** program allows Teen Tech Center participants at select locations to explore STEAM careers while gaining both technical and life skills.

Through career panels, company tours and engagement with professional mentors, teens learn about jobs in their communities and beyond. The program culminates in real-world experience through a paid internship with a local employer.

Each year, national nonprofit organizations deliver industry-relevant skills training to Teen Tech Center participants. Recent programming has focused on helping teens develop alternative sustainable materials for the fashion industry, explore film and media careers with on-set experiences, and embark on their own entrepreneurial ventures.



TEEN TECH CENTERS | LA COMMUNITY IMPACT HUB

Cultivating community to fuel the creative economy.

The **Los Angeles Community Impact Hub** launched in 2021 with a \$10 million investment and a focus on preparing youth for roles in the local creative economy. LA County-based Teen Tech Centers partner with other organizations on localized programs, including seminars and job-shadowing with top producers.

Together, we're helping to nurture a new generation of skilled professionals who will help the LA creative industry thrive.

Unlocking the potential of young entrepreneurs.

Led by the Los Angeles Community Impact Hub, the Young Innovators Accelerator (YIA) program provides teens with hands-on experience in entrepreneurship focused on local issues. Winners of the first YIA pitch competition in August 2023—including inventors of apps that link people with local street vendors and music performances—received college scholarship stipends.

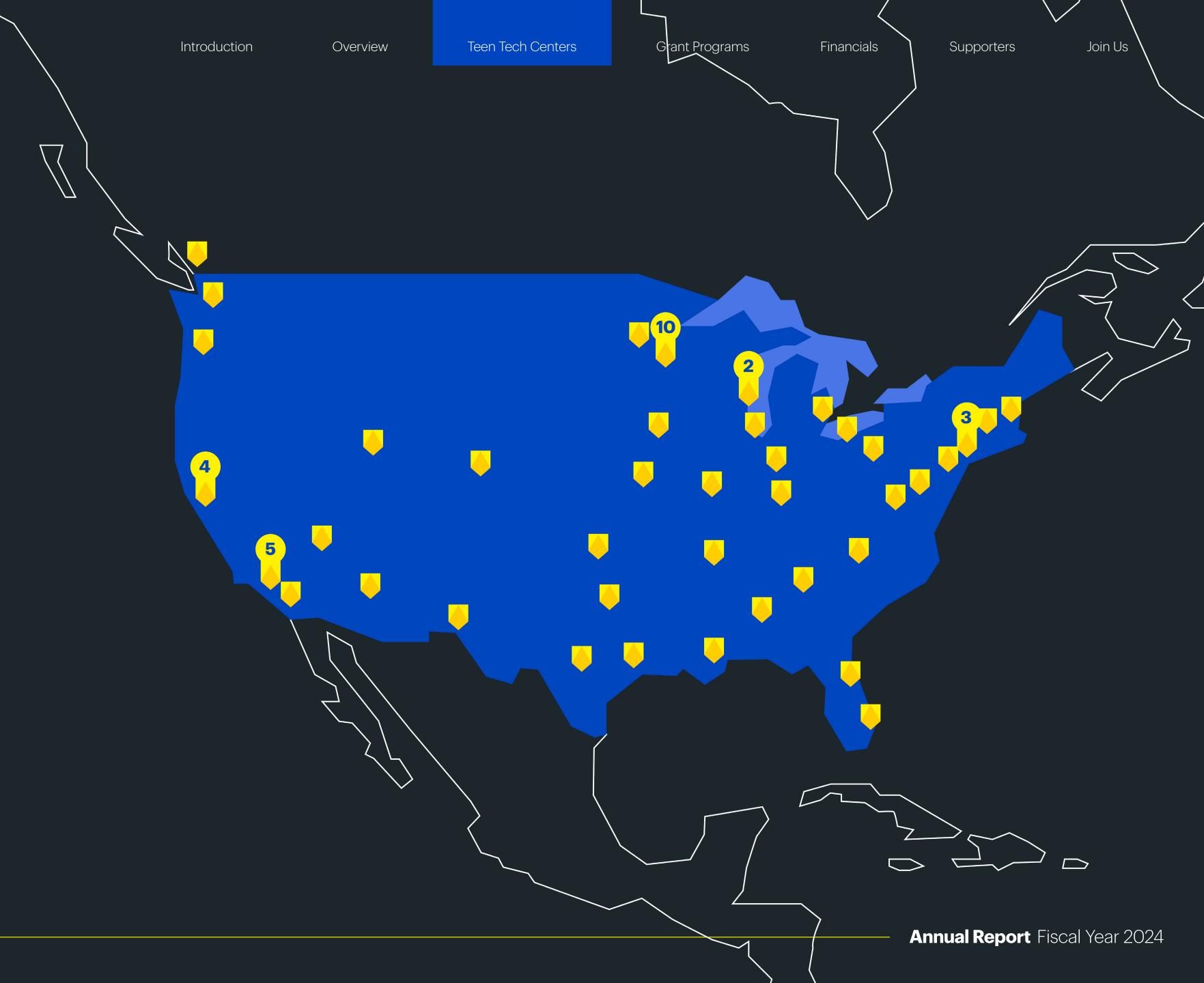

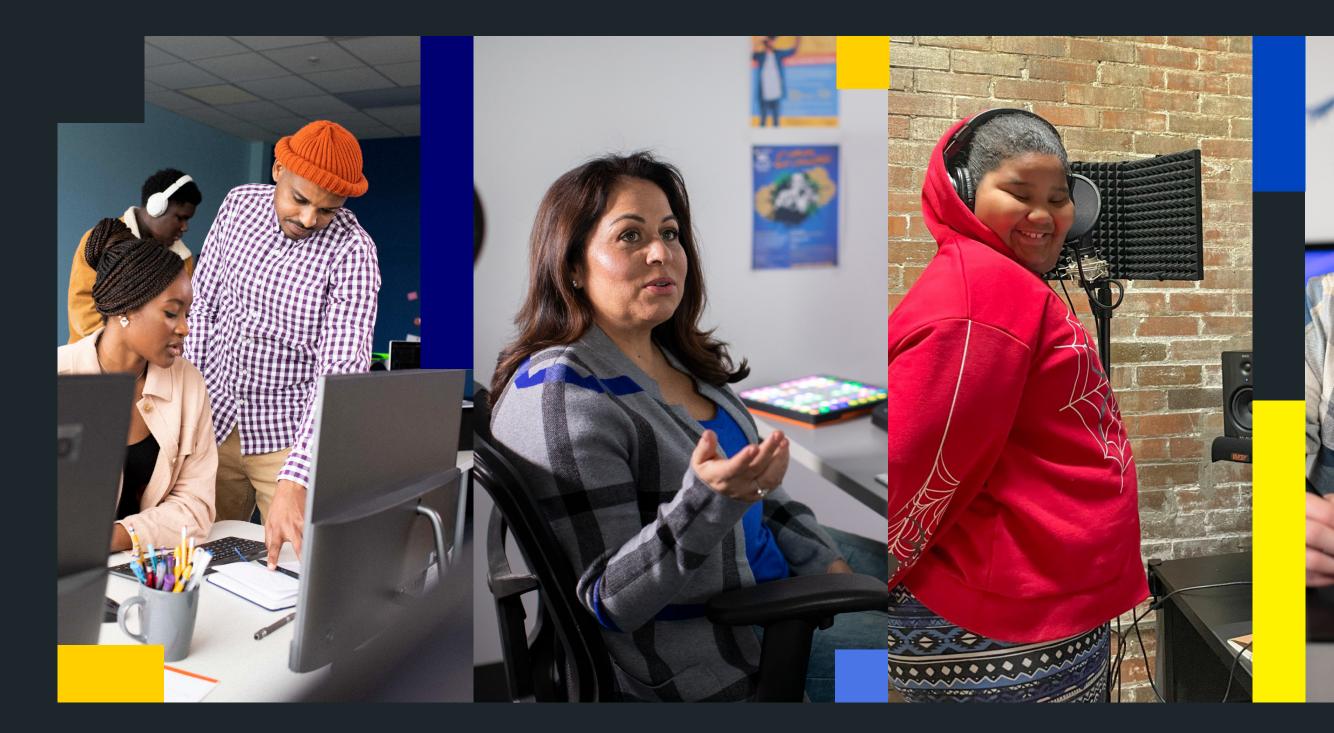
Investing in brighter futures—for young people and special places.

Best Buy Teen Tech Center Grants.

Awarded to local nonprofit partners to host Teen Tech Center locations. Funding contributes to construction and start-up costs, staffing, training and development, and ongoing career programming.

National Partner Grants.

Awarded to nonprofit organizations that provide hands-on STEAM skills training and paid summer internships to Teen Tech Center participants.

Twin Cities Fund.

Supports nonprofit youth programs in the seven-county Minneapolis-St. Paul metro area and arts and culture organizations that contribute to the vibrancy of the area. Funding is available for both programming and capital grants.

Seattle Fund.

Supports nonprofit youth programs in the King County metro area that provide teens from disinvested communities access to tech skills and career training.

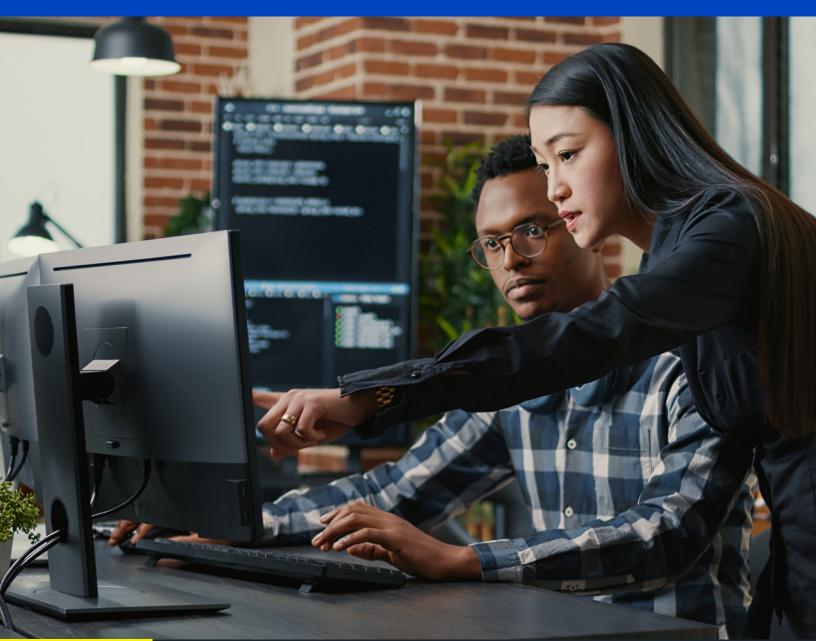


National Grant: Hispanic Heritage Foundation.

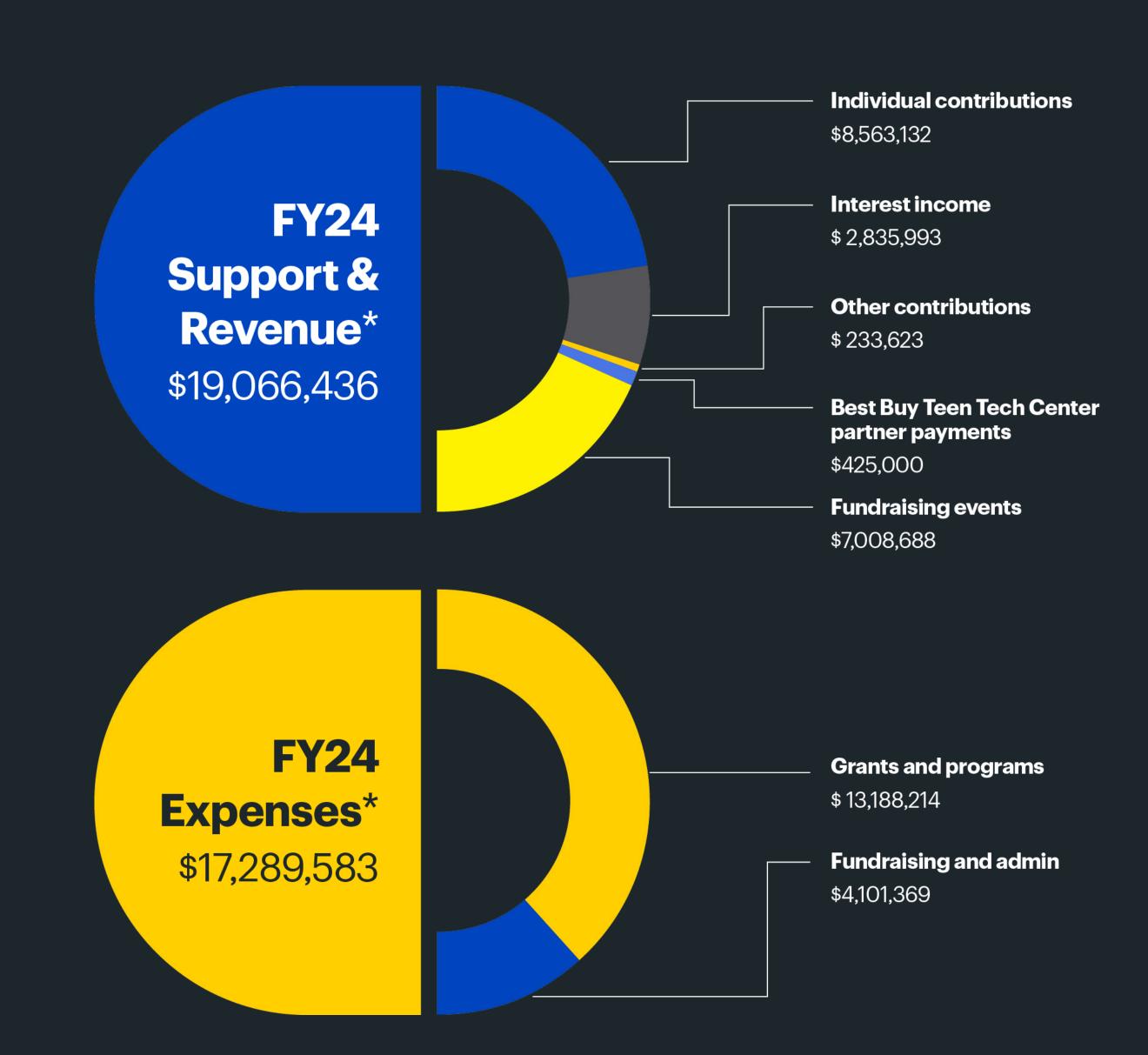

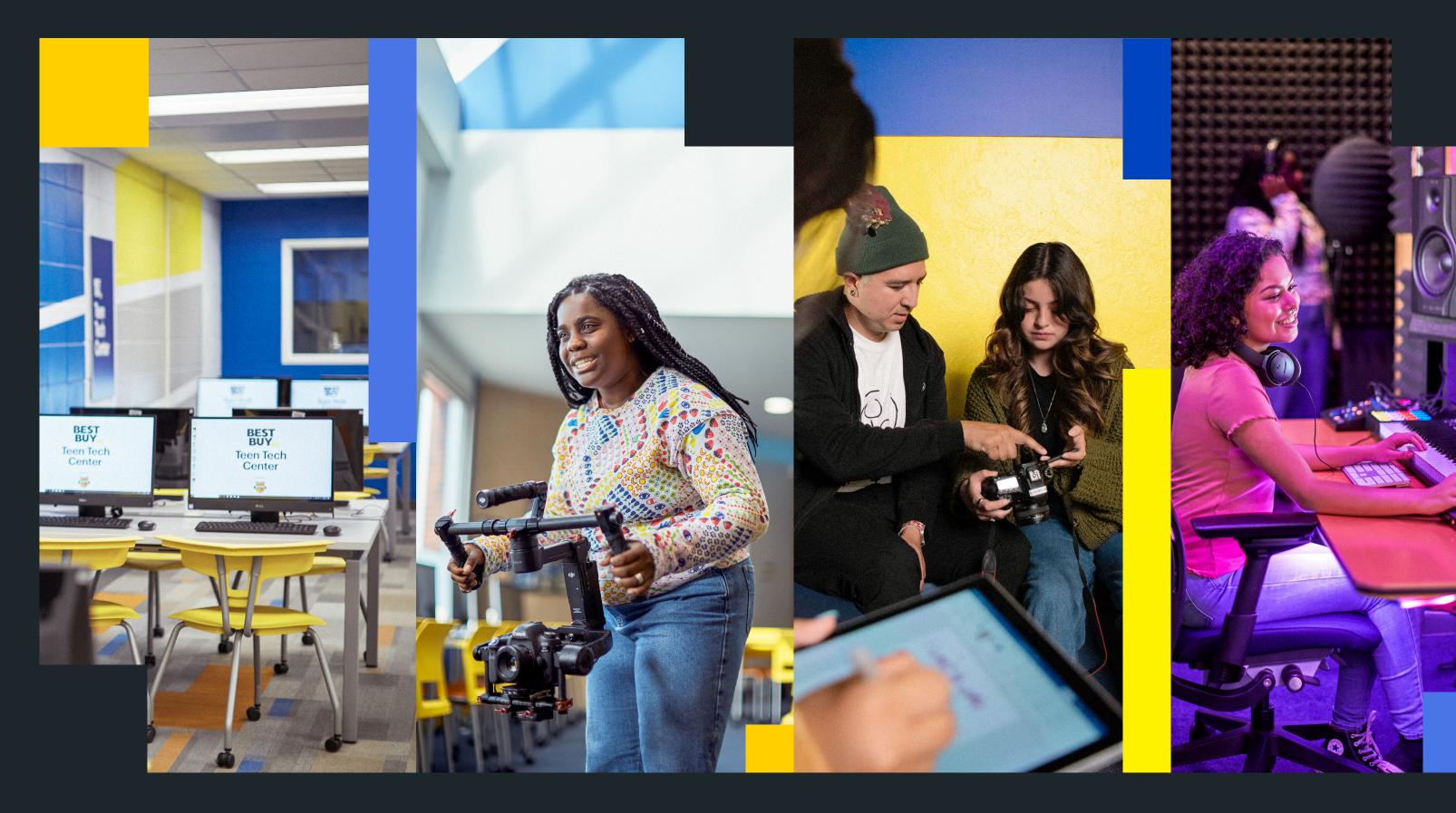
